Who can join?

To be eligible for membership as a Cadet one must:

Be 12-18 years old and a legal resident of Canada. Provide proof of provincial health insurance coverage or equivalent.

How much does it cost?

We are partially funded by the Department of National Defence in partnership with the civilian Air Cadet League of Canada. Local community support meets obligations such as accommodations, training aids/equipment & program enhancements not otherwise provided. Parents and Cadets are expected to participate in local fundraising events.

The Department of National Defence/Canadian Armed Forces assumes costs for uniform and travel for Cadets. Consequently, membership in the Cadet Program provides thousands of Canadian youth with unique opportunities **free of charge** that they might not otherwise experience — making the Cadet Program a viable option.
